The Biodiversity Research Programme (BRP) for Development in Mindanao is a five-year project jointly undertaken by Filipino and Dutch researchers in Mt. Malindang and its environs in Mindanao, southern Philippines.





The BRP was conceptualized and developed with the participation of local stakeholders, government agencies, NGOs, and the academe, and is funded by the Netherlands Ministry for Development Cooperation.

Objectives:

- To make biodiversity research more responsive to real-life problems and development needs of the local communities by introducing a new mode of knowledge generation for biodiversity management and conservation.
- To strengthen capacity for biodiversity research and decision-making by empowering the local research partners and other local stakeholders.

MISSION: The Biodiversity Research Programme for Development in Mindanao is committed to undertake and promote collaborative, participatory, and interdisciplinary research that will promote sustainable use of biological resources, and effective decision-making on biodiversity conservation to improve livelihood and cultural opportunities.

Mt. Malindang has unique landscapes and biodiversity which would be valuable to understand.

It has extensive and fairly well-defined water catchments emanating from its peaks and draining to the coastal zones of Misamis Occidental that exemplify the nature and elements of threats to biodiversity management and conservation in the Philippines.
